Management of Withdrawal from Drugs of Abuse in the Acute Care Setting (Knowledge Based)

- Discuss pathophysiology of addiction.
- Identify how common drugs of abuse alter neurotransmitter communication.

Anticoagulation for Atrial Fibrillation in the Elderly (Knowledge Based)

- Describe the pharmacology of warfarin and relate it to changes in the elderly.
- Compare and contrast the benefits and risks of anticoagulation for elderly patients in atrial fibrillation.
- Identify new anticoagulants for atrial fibrillation.

Hypertensive Crises (Knowledge Based)

- Differentiate between hypertensive urgencies and hypertensive emergencies.
- Identify preferred pharmacologic interventions for hypertensive urgencies and hypertensive emergencies.
- State goals of therapy for hypertensive urgencies and hypertensive emergencies.

Community Pharmacist Guide to Patient Triage: Stroke, Syncope, & Seizures (Application Based)

- Discuss the pathophysiology of stroke, syncope, and seizures.
- Identify symptoms of stroke, syncope, and seizures that require urgent care.
- Select appropriate questions to ask the patient based on presentation of symptoms.
- Given a patient case for each medical condition, evaluate the patient's symptomatology and facilitate a plan for emergent care.
